

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF WOMERSLEY PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE COURTYARD,
ON MONDAY 28TH JANUARY 2019 AT 7.00PM.**

413/01/19 WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

No apologies were received.

414/01/19 Public Forum

Ms Evison briefed the Council on the news that the route for the Tour de Yorkshire has been amended to bring the tour through the village. A roadshow presentation will be held at The Courtyard on 6th February 2019 which was open to all those interested in the event. Ms Evison hoped that all the residents would get behind the local organisers to make the event a great success. She also notified the Council that there is scoping work along the A1M which may result in the road coming between Womersley and Kirk Smeaton, as a landowner her views were that the current road should be upgraded not re-routed.

417/01/19 COUNCIL TO RECEIVE REPORTS FROM:

- b) District Councillor – There is to be a consultation at Cridling Stubbs village hall on the 30th January concerning Gale Common and another at Whitely Parish. The traffic concerns are the HGV movements which it is thought would be similar to those experienced with the UK Coal sites.
- c) County Councillor – Selby DC has passed the amended Network Rail plans to remove the proposal for a footbridge and allow footpath crossing only which was a turnaround since Network Rail had wanted to close the public crossing completely 3 years ago. Network Rail will not be able to reverse this decision unless it submits another planning application. The Station Road/Springfield crossing barriers have been adjusted these had been causing long delays (approximately 20 minutes each time). The long delays were a danger re emergency services being delayed and people late for work could be tempted to cross before the barriers were raised. Network Rail believed that the emergency services phoned to get the barriers raised but the police officers present confirmed that this was against their orders.

- e) Police – Cllr Whittles welcomed PCSO's Newbold and Thompson to the meeting in response to the Council's letters to the Police and Crime Commissioner. The officers could not detail any specific cases but gave advice on various matters and the importance of 101 calls or Crime stoppers to log any crime incidents no matter how small. From this information the intelligence officers can search the system and marry up information. The Police work closely with other agencies such as Selby DC and North Yorks Council. It was important that people should feel safe in their communities free from anti-social behaviour. As a result of numerous reports on the Community Messaging an arrest has been made in Fairburn in connection with the moped robberies.
